A DYNAMIC SCHOOL COMMUNITY

The past few weeks and months have been very dynamic for education and the Brady community. The dictionary defines dynamic as: (of a process or system) characterised by constant change, activity, or progress. The new curriculum introduced in 2014, along with associated Life Beyond Levels in 2015, the academy agenda and changes to the Education Secretary and white papers within the past 6 months are examples of such change. Here at Brady, the past 2 years have seen rapid changes that have brought about positive growth.
