 What has happened to language lessons?- Language lessons continue in school with French once a week in all KS2 classrooms. The new Numbots APP is repetitive and easy so she is bored by it which means it is hard to motivate her to do more- When a child is confident in Numbots, it can be discussed with the class teacher and potentially moved onto TT Rockstars. I'm not sure that my child is encouraged to achieve above average All children at the school are encouraged to achieve their very best in every lesson no matter the level they are at. This includes the more able children and is shown in the results we have achieved and the percentage of children attending grammar schools when leaving Brady. For lunchtime and PE sports acitivities are dominated by the more 'sporty' children. Even with teacher supervision, some children feel excluded(eg don't get a chance to pick teams or lose their turn at rounders or don't get passed to)- Mr Reynolds our PE specialist, is aware of these concerns and has already put into place systems to ensure that all children get a fair turn. This can at times be difficult with 237 children in the school and short periods of time to work in at lunch time, but we are working on it. Appreciate it if the homework system can be improved. At least for maths children can be given homework so we are aware of what is being covered- This is something we have been looking into as a staff team in order to try and best support the children with the homework that comes home. This will be reflected over the remainder of the year.
